

My ReconciliACTION Plan – example for museums and archives (67-70)

Learn and Reading the Canadian Museums Association (CMA) report, *Moved*

Understand by to Action: Activating UNDRIP in Canadian Museums.

Explore by Reading the Declaration's articles related to repatriation and control

over materials created or about them (8, 11, 12, 15, 31).

Recognize by Acknowledging the efforts of museums and archives repatriating

items back to community like Le Musée de Saint-Boniface Museum.

Take action by Encouraging museums, archives, and other institutions to enter

dialogues with Indigenous communities to repatriate human remains

from their collections.

Teach by Sharing Reconciliation resources complied by the CMA with others.

Learn and Understand: Learn about the Canadian Museums Association's (CMA) response to TRC Call to Action #67 under the guidance of the Reconciliation Council from the 2022 report, *Moved to Action: Activating UNDRIP in Canadian Museums* (https://museums.ca/uploaded/web/TRC_2022/Report-CMA-MovedToAction.pdf). There are approximately 6.7 million items (cultural artifacts and ancestral remains) in the care of Canadian institutions with repatriation being relevant to a quarter of them, yet few museums have formal repatriation policies.

Explore: Read the Declaration's articles related to repatriation and control over materials created or about them (including but not limited to 8, 11, 12, 15, 31) (https://www.un.org/development/desa/indigenouspeoples/wp-content/uploads/sites/19/2018/11/UNDRIP_E_web.pdf).

Recognize: Acknowledge the efforts of museums and archives that are repatriating items to community like Le Musée de Saint-Boniface Museum (https://www.cbc.ca/news/indigenous/tikinagan-repatriated-1.6411084).

Take action:

- 1. Encourage museums, archives, and other institutions to enter dialogues with Indigenous communities to repatriate human remains from their collections.
- 2. Reach out to MPs about a commitment to enact legislation to support the repatriation of Indigenous artifact and remains and provide dedicated funding to the repatriation process as per the CMA's recommendations.
