- Explore by** Learning about Bill C-5, *An Act to amend the Bills of Exchange Act, (National Day for Truth and Reconciliation)*.
- Recognize by** Honouring the work of Survivor groups working on commemoration initiatives like the *Assiniboia Residential School Legacy Group*.
- Take action by** Reaching out to regional governments to work in collaboration with Survivors to commission a Residential School Monument in each region to to honour Survivors and all the children who were lost.
- Teach by** Sharing information about the *Na-mi-quai-ni-mak Community Support Fund* and other support funds for commemoration.
